Developer Portal 2.0 Integration Impact Memo

May 14, 2019

On June 14, 2019, Fannie Mae will implement a new version of the Developer Portal 2.0. The changes in this release will not affect how integrated partners generate Client IDs, Client Secrets, Authorization Codes, Access Tokens or API Keys. This release will have no impact on integrated partners who have already successfully implemented a call to one of our APIs.

This release seeks to align our documentation with the actual behavior of the system. We encourage all customers to review their internal documentation to ensure their protocols and written processes accurately reflect the system's functionality.

Please review the updates described below and in the Developer Portal June 2019 <u>Release Notes</u> to ensure that your integrated systems are prepared to support this release prior to June 14, 2019.

Getting Started Guide

The content of the Getting Start Guide is updated to reflect the below corrections:

- Access Token time-to-live (TTL): 5 minutes vs. 24 hours
- Refresh Token time-to-live (TTL): 2 hours vs 7 days
- Refresh Token sample cURL: added missing authorization header
- Added URLs for the integration environment and CLVE environment
